- ✓ **Scalable** – Expand quickly by adding virtual lines and SIP trunks without hardware limits.
- ✓ **Modern Features** – Rich call handling, collaboration tools, and automatic updates.
- ⚠ **Ongoing Costs** – Requires subscription licensing and cloud hosting fees.
- ⚠ **SIP-Only** – Works exclusively with internet-based phone service (SIP trunks).

- ✓ **One-Time Investment** – No recurring license or hosting fees.
- ✓ **Flexible Service Options** – Can connect to your internet provider's analog phone lines or SIP trunks.
- ✓ **Simple & Reliable** – Basic desk phone experience with auto-attendant functionality included.
- ✓ **Scales to Your Budget** – No licensing restrictions on the number of simultaneous calls.
- ⚠ **Limited Mobility** – Primarily designed for one physical office; remote access is limited.
- ⚠ **Fewer Advanced Features** – No SMS; limited video conferencing, modern app integration.



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Which Is Right for You?

- **Choose Cloud-Hosted** if you need mobility, remote work capability, SMS, video conferencing, and seamless scaling across locations.
- **Choose On-Premises** if you want a low ongoing cost, a simple in-office phone setup, and/or already have analog lines from your provider that you wish to keep.
